Partnering in Medical Missions

This past July, Paraguay Baptist Medical Center Foundation (PBMCF) embarked on our eleventh medical mission trip to Paraguay, joining Centro Médico Bautista (CMB) in community outreach.

We brought 25 volunteers: doctors, nurses, an eye clinic team, occupational therapists, and translators, and even an engineering and computer systems consultant. We worked alongside CMB doctors, medical residents, and chaplains as well as residents from Fundación Visión at clinics hosted by four Baptist churches in urban and rural locations: Loma Pyta, Teko Pyahu-Caaguazú, Limpio, and Mbujapey.

Cintia Patiño, coordinator of the Department of Community Health at CMB, organizes this week of mobile clinics called CMB en tu Comunidad (CMB in Your Community). She testifies from personal experience to the importance of this ministry. Cintia grew up in a remote community, and she remembers every year that CMB en tu Comunidad would come to visit. Instead of walking eight kilometers to see a doctor, she and her eight brothers and sisters could receive

- Approximately 959 services were provided at the clinics
- 457 medical consultations
- 271 people received vision exams
 192 fitted with glasses
 40 were referred for more complex care
- 231 people visited with CMB chaplains

Update on Community Health Programs at Centro Médico Bautista

Paraguay Baptist Medical Center Foundation (PBMCF) continues to support community health outreach at Centro Médico Bautista (CMB) as we have done since our inception.

Cintia Patiño, coordinator of the Department of Community Health at CMB, and Alicia Díaz de Lezcano, who previously led the department for 18 years and now in her retirement serves as the president of Fundación Centro Médico Bautista, secretary of the CMB board of directors, and president of the UCMB council, both contributed information on the current programing in this department.

Your donations towards community health help to support:

■ CMB en tu Comunidad (CMB in Your Community) which provides health care attention to communities in locations away from the hospital. Baptist churches in urban or rural areas of Paraguay host these one-day clinics in their church buildings. Before the COVID-19 pandemic, every year a team of CMB health care professionals would schedule several clinic days at various sites and

travel to each location. On the alternate year, PBMCF would organize a medical mission trip and join the CMB team for a week of mobile clinics. During the pandemic, CMB en tu Comunidad was on hiatus. The 2023 PBMCF medical mission trip renewed this important ministry of CMB.

- Bloque D clinic, the original community clinic, which is a building on the CMB campus with easy access to the street that continues to provide reduced cost health care to "comunitario" patients who qualify on a sliding income scale.
- Financial assistance to hardship requests from "comunitario" and "hospitalario" patients, two of the lowest classifications on a sliding income scale. Patients in these categories now receive health care services throughout the hospital, not limited to the original community clinic.
- Medications and supplies to a small site in Carapeguá that provides basic health care services to the surrounding community.
